CELEBRATION 2018 – FAQ's

What does it cost? What is included?

VCQ Members: \$385; Non-members: \$485; Day Students VCQ member \$310; Non-members: \$410. (If you would like to become a VCQ member, please visit the web site at <u>www.vcq.org/join.htm</u>.) Celebration 2018 fee includes lodging, meals, all workshops (except kit fees & supplies), lectures, and special events.

What is the Vi Graves Celebration Scholarship?

The *Vi Graves Celebration Scholarship* was established to provide financial support for VCQ members to attend the biennial event. Vi was a VCQ member who loved Celebration and lost her life to cancer. Scholarships can be for the full Celebration cost, or partial, depending on need and funds available. Applications are submitted to the VCQ President who along with the Vice President will determine the number and amount of scholarships granted. This process is confidential. If a member knows of a particular need and would like to nominate a member to receive the scholarship, she may either submit a completed form on behalf of the nominee or send the name to the President who will send the application form to the nominee. The deadline for submission of the application for a Celebration scholarship is February 1, 2018. The Application form is on page 28.

How do I register?

The \$100 <u>non-refundable</u> deposit must accompany your registration form (last page of brochure). A paid deposit reserves your space and will be deducted from the total cost. All deposits will be recorded in the sequence in which they are received with workshops assigned accordingly. Those attending the August meeting are given priority over individuals that are not attending the meeting. Mailed registrations will not be recorded until after the August meeting but will be processed according to when they were postmarked. Non-members will be registered beginning September 1. Please make <u>checks payable to VCQ (notation: Celebration 2018).</u> Mailed registration forms are to be sent to **Karin McElvein,1309 Maplewood Ave, Norfolk VA 23503**. Registration closes March 1, 2018, or earlier if capacity is reached.

When is final payment due?

Final payments must be received by March 1, 2018. The total cost may be paid in installments, as long as the total is received by March 1, 2018. Remember to keep your VCQ membership up-to-date. What is the cancellation policy?

Cancellation requests must be submitted in writing to Susan Beard, 3610 Seminary Ave, Richmond VA 23227 OR emailed to <u>celebration@vcq.org</u>. While the deposit will not be refunded, refunds of additional payments will be issued only for requests postmarked or emailed <u>before February 1, 2018</u>, due to commitments to the 4-H Center and teachers.

What about lodging?

Housing is dormitory style in rooms accommodating a maximum of four (4) Each room has a private bath with shower, heat and air-conditioning, and ample storage. Handicapped facilities are available. Please indicate your needs on the registration form. Refrigerators and ice machines are available in the dormitories. There will be a three person minimum; four person maximum per room. PLEASE INDICATE YOUR ROOMMATES' NAMES/PREFERENCES ON THE REGISTRATION FORM (4th bed is a trundle so please keep this in mind when selecting your roommates). SML 4-H Center is a non-smoking facility. Bed linens, pillow, blanket, and towels are provided. If desired, you may bring a bath mat, extra towel, extra pillow, hangers, and quilt for your bed.

Meals are buffet style in the dining hall. Three meals per day are provided (beginning with dinner on Thursday and ending with breakfast on Sunday). EVENTS AND SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

Workshop Format:

Six-hour workshops are offered on Friday and Saturday along with "Come Quilt with Me." All options are summarized on page 9.

Silent Auction:

We would like to make this Celebration's Silent Auction the best ever. Our intent is to offer some of the best handmade items, fabrics, kits, sewing machines, and other like items. So start sewing! A Tax Receipt form will be available upon request when you bring your items to any of the upcoming VCQ meetings or to Celebration 2018 on Thursday, April 26th. However, please do not clean out your sewing room and grab just any old thing. We reserve the right to put items on the Peddler's Table. Any questions, please contact Susan Beard.

Peddler's Table:

In addition to the Silent Auction, there will be a Peddler's Table for yard sale type items (outdated books/magazines, fabrics, tools, notions that would not be suitable for the Silent Auction). These items will be available for a small donation. If you have any items you want to donate; PLEASE BRING THEM WITH YOU TO CELEBRATION. (The Committee will have plenty to transport and will not be able to bring these items also).

Block Lotto:

This was one of the most exciting activities of past Celebrations! In the meetings, prior to Celebration, you may purchase a packet containing fabric pieces along with directions for making the block. The block will also need a need a <u>Solid Colored fabric</u> in addition to the pieces in the packet. A tone-on-tone or batik will not work; the additional piece needs to be a solid color. Several pre-cut solids currently are available for a nominal charge when purchasing the packet. For each block you complete, your name will be put into a drawing to win enough sets of blocks for a quilt top. The number of sets will depend on how many blocks are turned in. Buck Night (THURS): Participation Optional

Meet and greet each teacher, who will have a table to display their kits, supplies, patterns, and books for sale before dinner on Thursday evening. Let this be the Celebration that you challenge yourself to express your inner quilt-y-ness. How will you interpret the theme "A Circle of Friends-- Silver and Gold"? Will it be blinged-out in Silver and Gold? Maybe dedicated to or in memory of a special friend? Could it show some facet of yourself that welcomes new friendships or maintains them?

The challenge quilts will be displayed at Celebration and will be eligible for several Viewers' Choice Awards. You are encouraged to submit quilts from ALL genres of quilting – traditional, modern, pieced, applique, and art.

The guidelines are simple:

- 1. Total perimeter is a minimum of 36" and a maximum of 72" or any shape fitting within those dimensions.
- 2. Quilts must have some method of hanging attached such as a sleeve to accommodate a 1-inch diameter rod OR corner triangles with a rigid rod included OR a hanging loop. In all cases, the method should ensure that the quilt hangs flat.
- 3. Include a label on the back with at least the Title, Maker's Name*, City/State, and Date. *You, as the maker, should also be the designer for an original work of art.
- 4. The deadline for this challenge is Check-In on April 26, 2018.

Susan also has hosted many Schoolhouse programs at International Quilt Market and has provided trunk shows and workshops for quilt shops and guilds. In addition to quilt patterns and books, she has designed the Monogram Buttons for Dill Buttons and has collaborated on two rulers for Creative Grids. Her talents also include designing for Michael Miller Fabrics and creating the Clubhouse Quilt Club, a progressive quilt program. Susan is actively involved in the quilting industry, a member of the International Association of Creative Arts Professionals, a founding member of Richmond Modern Quilt Guild and an Aurifil Thread Specialist.

Melinda Bula is an award winning quilt artist, instructor, and author. She lives in California and has been sewing and painting since she was a young girl. Her *Fabulous Fusible Flowers* quilts are unique with the wonderful look of a painting. She uses fabric and thread to create beautifully artistic

quilts. She has been lecturing and teaching, both in the United States and internationally, since 2005. Her quilts have been featured in numerous magazines, museums, and galleries. Melinda has written two books on her "Fabulous Fusible Flowers" technique, *Cutting Garden Quilts* and *Candy Cane Lane*, both published by the Martingale Company. She has created two instructional videos for the new *I Quilt.com*, an online site for quilting classes. In 2013, the National Quilt Museum in Paducah, Kentucky bought Melinda's quilt "...and Our Flag was Still There!"

Carolyn Friedlander https://carolynfriedlander.com/

Carolyn Friedlander is an artist specializing in modern fabric designs, sewing and quilt patterns, and quilt making with intention. She grew up on a cattle and citrus ranch in Lake Wales, Florida, where she spent most of her free time immersed in drawing, painting, and sewing. She earned a B.A. in Architecture from Washington University in St. Louis. After a stint in architecture, Carolyn sought a different occupation that would allow her to be wildly creative and work with her hands. She quickly recognized quilting as a new passion and set out to learn everything she could about the craft. She was drawn to bright and bold fabrics and saw a need for clean, modern patterns. In 2010, she founded her business, Carolyn Friedlander LLC. Today Carolyn is an active presence, collaborating with industry leaders to reach quilters worldwide. Her book, *Savor Each Stitch: Studio Quilting with Mindful Design* was published in 2014, and she has designed several lines of fabric with Robert Kaufman since 2012. Her aesthetic draws on elements of art, architecture, and the history of quilt making. Carolyn is proud to bring her process and aesthetic to the rich history and tradition of quilting. Her mission is to honor the art's venerable legacy, both by creating original handmade pieces and by providing a roadmap for others to do the same.

Mary Huey http://maryhueyquilts.blogspot.com/

In spite of vowing, she would never move back to her hometown when she left for college, Mary returned to Willoughby, Ohio and is still there! What began as a grade school interest in sewing progressed into a degree in clothing and retailing from Miami University, Oxford, Ohio. Upon graduation, Mary worked for the Ohio Cooperative Extension Service until she "retired" to raise three children with her husband, Doug. During that time, Mary became hooked on guilt making and was soon teaching others. Teaching led to a hunger for better supplies and in 1979, the opening of her store, Erie Street Quilts in Willoughby. During the next decade, Mary attended seminars given by Mary Ellen Hopkins, author of It's Okay to Sit on My Quilt. The skills and techniques she learned from Mary Ellen continue to influence her work style and teaching approach. In the 1990's Mary expanded her designing work through her consulting work with King Road Imports of California. This has led to designing annual mystery guilt projects for her shop and the Northern Ohio Quilt Shop Hop. In 2005, after 26 years, Mary closed her Erie Street Quilts shop and focused on teaching and expanding her pattern line. At the same time, Mary began to work with Marti Michell of Atlanta and is a certified educator for Marti's extensive line of rotary cutting templates and tools. Mary's classes and workshops are designed to stretch students at all levels and to challenge them to step up to new degrees of satisfaction in their skills.

FRIDAY CLASSES

Workshop #101

Karla Alexander

Circle Play

All - Skill Builder

Curves have never been so much fun! No worries if you have never sewn curves before OR if you prefer straight seams, you will leave class a Master! Come ready to experiment and learn exciting new piecing techniques for basic arcs to easy full set-in circles as well as improvisational techniques. Nothing is set in stone; changes can happen, and you will be encouraged to follow your instincts while exploring additional options along the way. There are three design options available: In a Nutshell, Clam Shells, and Lanterns. The latter two appear below.

- Follow pre-planned pattern (purchase fabric according to pattern) P446 In a Nutshell; P445 Clam Shells; P444 Lanterns (see pictures below)
- Come ready for improvisational techniques

Supplies

- Sewing Machine in good working order
- Basic rotary cutting and sewing supplies
- 9 1/2" x 9 1/2" or larger square ruler (10" + makes it easy to cut your squares for the blocks)
- For perfect arcs and set it circles you will need the Circle Savvy Ruler by Creative Grids
- For improvisational techniques, you will need a 6" x 12" ruler

Fabric Tips

In this class and you will be learning how to work with curves and circles. The largest fabric piece needed is a fat quarter; however, we will be playing with 5" charm packs and 10" layer Cakes as well. Bring a minimum of 8 contrasting fat quarters (prints or batiks); more choices equal more fun. We will be auditioning different fabric choices along the way – so be prepared to be flexible! If you wish to practice before committing, bring fabric to play with and then move on to the fabrics you love. Again – more is better!

Laura Blanchard Reversible Strippy Table Runner Int – piecing & quilting

Choose a Bali Pop, Jelly Roll, or any strip pack with forty 2 1/2" strips (or cut your own strips) to make this strip pieced, reversible table runner. What you'll learn: correct use of a square ruler, sewing diagonal sets, use of fusible batting, tips on threads for stitching in the ditch and how to bind an edge with a 45° angled corner.

Supply List

- Pattern: "Reversible Strippy Table Runner" by Plum Tree Quilts (Order pattern BEFORE workshop from: www.plumtreequilts.com; for free shipping use code FREESHIP.)
- Sewing machine with 1/4" foot AND walking foot;
- General sewing supplies
- Cutting mat and rotary cutter with new/sharp blade

Fabrics Requirements

- Forty 2 1/2" strips (one jelly roll, Bali pop, etc. or cut your own strips) and
- 5/8 yard for binding;
- 50 wt. cotton thread for piecing;
- Invisafil thread for stitching in the ditch will be available for purchase in class (\$3.00/spool), or you can bring thread of choice;
- 12 1/2" or larger square acrylic ruler;
- Batting: I will have pre-cut Hobbs two-sided fusible batting for sale (\$5.00), or you can bring your own two-sided fusible batting or regular batting with spray baste (to be sprayed outside) cut to size given in the pattern.

Pre-cutting and sewing:

- <u>Before coming to class</u>, decide how you want to arrange your strips for the Six (6) strip sets and SEW THE Six (6) STRIP SETS as instructed on page 1 of the pattern (Figure 1).
- For best results sew a straight, consistent seam allowance. Press as directed.
- [NOTE: Strips can be arranged any way you like for each strip set, but I have found that arranging strips from light to dark in each strip set provides good results in the finished runner. If your strips are pretty much the same value, arrange them so they are pleasing to your eye.]
- From the binding fabric, cut four 2 1/4" x width of fabric strips. Prepare the strips for binding by sewing together end to end and pressing the joined strips in half lengthwise. Bring leftover binding fabric to class.

Workshop #103

AUGUSTA COLE Strips, Stripped, & Stripping All - foundation piecing

A stash buster for sure! Bring your strips cut and be ready to sew them to begin your new quilt. This is just fast, fun, and easy – plus you are busting your stash! You can use 1", 1.5", and 2" strips. While the length of the strips does not matter, short & medium work best. If you want to repeat one color throughout, longer strips work well. An example is in the picture with the red being constant. The repeated color strips are cut 2.5". The size of the strips depends on the size of the foundation square you use. You can use a 4.5" square to finish to a 4" square and a 5.5" square to finish to a 5" square. For a repeated color sashing, use 6.5" to finish to 6". Contrast is so very important: Suggestion is to

use mainly dark and light strips; use few or no medium. There are different designs you can do with these stripping squares. Come and learn the tricks, begin your squares and see where they lead you.

From Lynchburg / Bedford

From Rt. 460, take second Bedford exit for Rt. 122 S (There will be signs for Smith Mountain Lake.) At the traffic light, take a left or right (depends on your direction) onto 122 S. Go 19.8 miles to a traffic light at the intersection of Rt. 122 and Rt. 616 (Optical Office on the right). Turn LEFT onto Scruggs Rd. (Rt. 616). Go 0.8 miles and take a RIGHT (shortly past Dairy Queen) onto Brooks Mill Rd. (Rt. 834). (The green street sign will be on the left side of the road.). Go 2.8 miles until you come to a stop sign. (Dick's Food Center will be directly in front of you.). Take a LEFT onto Burnt Chimney Rd. Go 2.5 miles to Rt. 668. (Dudley's Schoolhouse Store will be on the right directly past the road.) From Northern Virginia
