

## VCQ Celebration 2020 Block Lotto

## $\underline{\mathcal{P} \mathcal{A} \mathcal{H} S} \&$ STILES

## In this kit:

- Instructions to make this 9 in. finished block. This is a 9-patch made up of four half-square triangle units, four rail-fence units and one $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square which, when sewn together, create a $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ unfinished block.
- Background fabric: 2 strips @ $1 \frac{1}{2}{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 15^{\prime \prime}$ and 1 strip @ 4 " $\times 8$ 8"

If you selected the Dark Batik background, add contrasting batik in any color or pattern.

If you selected the Cream Grunge background, add a contrasting print of your choice (flowers, fruit, geometric, novelty, etc.)

## Cutting

From your fabric: cut one strip @ $4^{\prime \prime} \times 8^{\prime \prime}$, one strip @ $1^{1 / 2 \prime} \times 15^{\prime \prime}$ strip and one $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square.

## Piecing

Make 4 half-square triangle units using one $4 " \times 8$ " strip of the background fabric and one 4 " x 8 " strip of your fabric. Mark the center point of the 8 " length on the back of the lightest one and draw a line across the

Press the four units to the dark fabric.
Trim to $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares.

Sew the $1 \frac{1 / 2 "}{}$ wide strips together along the $15^{\prime \prime}$ length to create a strip set: Background/Your fabric/Background. Press seam allowances to the darkest fabric.
Cut into four $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ lengths. There will be a scrap left over. (C)


Then draw two diagonal lines from the opposite corners to the center mark as shown. (A)

Stack right-sides-together. Sew a scant $1 / 4$ " seam on each side of the drawn lines. Cut on the drawn lines to create four half-square triangle units. (B)

Layout the nine units to create the block.


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\text { Col } 1 \quad \text { Col } 2 \quad \text { Col } 3
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Sew the units together in columns by sewing the first and second units first. Add the third unit of each column.

Press seams away from the middle unit of the $1^{\text {st }}$ and $3^{\text {rd }}$ columns. Press the seams towards the middle unit of the $2^{\text {nd }}$ column.


Sew the columns together, nesting the seam allowances. Press.

Trim the block to a $91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square making sure there is $1 / 4$ " seam allowance on all sides so your block can be sewn to another block.
