A new year with new beginnings for VCQ! I am honored to be tapped as president of VCQ and

represent the organization across the state. We have a very busy year ahead with retreats, Celebration and local activities.

The VCQ Board Retreat in January resulted in several things you need to know.

- If a member passes away and has a balance of dues already paid to VCQ, that balance will be added to the Vi Graves Scholarship Fund, with the approval of the heirs. This fund helps support anyone wishing to attend Celebration, but not able to pay the fee. Donations may also be made by anyone at any time to increase the funds available. Applications requesting assistance are sent to the VCQ President.
- As of 2020, newsletters will no longer be printed and mailed to members. The costs are just too prohibitive to the organization. VCQ General Meeting – November 9, 2019 Annandale

Call to order by Vice President Betsy Powell at 12:50 PM. Betsy welcomed everyone and greeted guests. New members were given pins and gifts. Minutes of the August 2019 meeting were published in the September newsletter. They were accepted as published.

Two open positions, Facilities and programs with their job descriptions were presented and discussed.

Treasurer: Karen Brewster handed out her VCQ treasurer's report. She said we are in the black as we have increased our membership. However, the expenses for this meeting have not been recorded at this time.

Community Service: Karin McElvein announced that VCQ had again won first place for delivering the most quilts to the Hopes and Dreams program at Quilter's Dream Batting. She hoped everyone had helped themselves to the box of goodies that Quilters Dream Batting provided that she brought with her to the meeting. She has a

2nd box which she will bring to the March Meeting. VCQ had given almost 30 quilts to them for ALS. She also delivered almost 75 bassinet covers to CHKD and Sentara in Norfolk. Today, she received 3 quilts for ALS and over 50 basinet covers. She thanked everyone for their participation.

Betsy then brought up the first proposed board suggestion to limit the number of meetings (retreats) to 3 each year. They would occur in the following months: March, June and October. Wendy Collier made a motion to accept the proposal and Karin McElvein 2nd it. There was much discussion. The motion passed. The 2nd proposal was to move the meeting day from the 2nd Saturday in the month to the third Saturday of the Month. Terry Hanson made a motion to accept the proposal, 2nd by Elaine Breiner. 

ALS Block – 9-Patch – For March VCQ Meeting

The Hopes & Dreams for ALS research sponsored by Quilters Dream Batting continues into 2020.

VCQ members turn in blocks to be made into a colorful top. This top is donated and money raised goes to ALS research.

This month create 9 1/2" unfinished 9-patch blocks (which will later be used in a Disappearing 9-patch design).

Make the four corners and the center in brights, with the four remaining squares in light/medium creams. Each square is 3 1/2". Try to make more than one.

Workshop A: "AWork of Heart" with Joy Duke

Workshop Description: "A Work of Heart" – Students will use Inktense pencils to transform plain white bamboo felt into a lovely "colorwash" background for their project. While their background fabric is drying, they will use my "Sweet Heart" pattern to choose the shades of bamboo felt and perle cotton that they will use to complete the appliques and begin stitching using the materials in their kits. We will learn buttonhole stitch, French knots, lazy daisy and stem stitches during this class as well as using the Inktense pencils. Come and have fun playing with the Inktense pencils and bamboo felt to create your "Work of Heart". Your finished project will be perfect for framing, making into a sachet, adorning the front of a totebag or pillow, or for a small decoration suitable to hang on one of those cute wire hangers.

Technique: Hand work and Inktense pencil painting

Skill Level Required: All levels

Supply List: Scissors (paper and fabric), needle threader or eyeglasses if needed

Kit Fee: \$18 – Includes pattern, bamboo felt, Chenille needle, Valdani perle cotton, freezer paper, tissue paper,

and the use of the instructor's Inktense pencils.

Fabric Requirements: Kit required

About your teacher: Joy Duke is a designer, teacher, and lecturer for Joyous Appliqué Designs. She has always enjoyed playing with fabrics and she created her first crazy quilt as a school project in the early 80's which got her out of having to write a research paper - now that was a deal!

In 2012, Joyous Applique Designs was born with 5 original patterns and Joy hasn't stopped designing and teaching since. All of Joy's 90+ patterns are ones that can be stitched within a reasonable time frame – no yearlong or life-long creations here. Joy wants her students to have fun and see real progress each time they pick up their work to stitch. Fusible applique using cotton fabrics was where Joy started and then she added yo-yos to her patterns to add additional texture and bring yo-yos back into the spotlight. These project types are very portable for hand stitching. Joy's latest passion is bamboo felt applique which is very similar to wool applique, but allows those that are allergic to wool to create beautiful fun pieces of art and those that enjoy wool to have a larger palette of fabrics to work with.

Workshop B: Collage Quilt with Carole Harris and Debby Coleman







Workshop Description:

The Collage quilt technique is all about playing with fabric. You layer and place the fabric, by fusing, to create the overall design. It can be highly decorative or very simplistic. There isn't any piecing or sewing done until the very end when you are securing the layers and quilting. Colors and designs on the fabric are used to create the shadows or highlights in the image. The fabric can be of any size, pattern or color. When placed together in layers with other fabrics, they come together to make the whole image. A lot of times you don't see the idea until you step back from the quilt. They are really great fun and you can make a hole in your stash by using your scraps.

Supply List: Either Hip Hop Rabbit or Featherweight Collage Pattern by Laura Heine-please pre-purchase this pattern from your local quilt shop or an on-line source. Each student must purchase the pattern.

(we teach a variety of tips and tricks so please do not follow the supply list included on the pattern)

Fabric for the background of either the rabbit or sewing machine to fuse your collage onto

Selection of fabrics to use for collage (*please wash all fabric*)

Pen Sharp fabric scissors
Pencil Paper cutting scissors

Freezer paper Soft fuse Parchment paper Frixion Pen

Small pressing surface

Craft Iron

About your teacher: Carole & Debby have a long history of quilting, especially handwork. They began playing with collage quilts several years ago since when they have made many wall hangings featuring a variety of animals and have taught the class numerous times.



Workshop C: Thread Painted Great Blue Herron with Darlene Price

Your kit will include the photo printed on fabric, stabilized with canvas. I have chosen 30 colors of #40 polyester thread that will be available to use. You may bring your own threads. Refer to photo to choose colors. Kit cost: \$10

Skill Level: Fearless

Supply List: Sewing machine set up for free motion quilting and ability to drop feed dogs.

Fresh Size 14 or embroidery needle installed in machine

Bobbins in light, medium and dark (2 white plus 1 medium and 1 dark gray)

Small snip or embroidery scissors

Tweezers for pulling up threads from bobbin

Free motion gloves, optional

Kit Fee: \$10. Kit includes photo printed on fabric and stabilized and threads used to stitch during the class. The thread painting portion of the project is able to be completed during class.

About your teacher: While fairly new to quilting, I've been around a needle and thread and a sewing machine all my life. My goal when I retired from life as a Commercial Real Estate Paralegal was to figure out quilting. In 2013, armed with a needle, thread and cardboard templates I embarked on my first quilt. When I got to the binding, I couldn't figure out how to do that by hand so I bought a machine. I haven't looked back and am the happiest I have even been. Shortly after outfitting my two beds with quilts I realized I still wanted to sew more but didn't need any more quilts. I turned to Art Quilts. Thread painting combines my love of photography and sewing.
