#### MINUTES OF THE LAST GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

#### VCQ General Membership Meeting

Zoom Meeting

Saturday March 9, 2024

The meeting was called to order at 9:08 by President Karen Brewster. President Brewster welcomed everyone.

#### Announcements:

Karen Brewster announced that we needed to vote on the minutes from the October 2023 meeting. Karin McElvein made a motion that the October General Meeting minutes be approved. Selwyn Knap seconded the motion. The motion passed.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**Membership:** Faye Hannah- Faye announced that we currently have 253 members and that 20 new members have joined in 2024.

**Celebration:** Deb Schupp announced that we are full for Celebration! The Committees are all good and moving along. The teachers are all very excited. Tuesday and Wednesday will be setup. Thursday will be when the teachers and registrants will arrive. We are looking for volunteers for Celebration 2026 for the committees. It would be great to have 2-3 people who would want to be chair. Anyone interested can contact Karen Brewster or Deb Schupp.

**Silent Auction:** Karilyn Pittman-Karilyn explained that the silent auction is one of the best ways we have to keep the cost down for Celebration. They are looking for kits, fabrics, etc. that members no longer want. Please bring to Celebration to the Main Building. There is a form being sent out that needs to be filled out and turned in with each item donated.

**Door Prizes:** Lynn Garver-Anyone that has something to donate for door prizes please email her to let her know what it is. Anything that can't be used can go to Silent Auction or the "free area".

**Ruby Challenge:** Kelly Zuber & Marty Moon-Anyone who is entering the challenge should send their name and size of the quilt to them now. They need to figure out the space needed to hang them all.

Deb Schupp will have an email sent out to all attendees with all the details in the next few weeks.

**Treasurer:** Paula Hutt first wanted to thank Wendy Collyer for staying on until she felt well enough to begin to take over the position. The Balance Sheet ending on 12/31/2023 has total assets at \$56,494.06. Our total income was \$18,967.75 and our total expenses were \$13,480.00 leaving us an income of \$5,487.75. A motion was made by Karin McElvein to accept the report. Selwyn Knap seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Paula Hutt reported that as of February 29, 2024 our Total Income is \$6,386.07. Our Total Expenses are \$483. Our Net Income is \$5,902. A motion was made by Selwyn Knapp to accept the report. Kathy McCrea seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The question was presented to Paula about a financial report for Celebration. She and Deb Schupp explained that Celebration has its own Profit & Loss statement.

It was also brought up that we do not need to vote on the Financial report every meeting. It will be looked at in the Policy & Procedures of how it was set up as it has been done that way for quite a while.

**Newsletter:** Kathy Gray announced the deadline for the next newsletter is April 15th. Write ups are welcome to be included about places or events members have attended, tips or tricks, new quilting gadgets, etc. that members would like to share. Kitty Bull will be sending some history on Celebration to share.

**Virtual Programs:** Elizabeth Gibson announced that the February David Sirota workshops went well. The membership filled both days. We made \$460 profit on the workshops and that was after paying David his \$1,640. Elizabeth would like to see a Late Summer/Early Fall workshop/event. If anyone would like to help plan that please contact Elizabeth or Karen Brewster. Any suggestions are welcome-online does not have to be local so we can look world-wide.

**In-Person Programs**: Debi Harding announced that our next in person meeting is June 8th in Harrisonburg. We will be doing tours of the Quilt Museum in small groups. It will be a Community Service day hosting Come Quilt With Me, Bassinette Covers and ALS Quilts. Everything will be kitted up so we can just produce a wonderful number of items to donate. We will also have some pop-up demos by members that are just 5 or 10 minute presentation. The October meeting is slated to be held in Williamsburg.

**OLD BUSINESS**: Karen Brewster reported that Block of the Month with Debby Kratovil has 92 people signed up. It is members only and free of charge. Karen asked members that are completing their blocks to post them on Facebook as they do so.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Karen Brewster announced that 2024 is Debi Harding's last year of chairing the In-Person meetings. She has been doing it for many years. Jan Farrow has stepped up to take her place and is currently assisting her as well. We would like to form a committee for this as there is lots of things that are done behind the scenes. If interested, please contact Jan Farrow or Karen Brewster.

Karen Brewster announced that **Technology** is transitioning from Mary Grogan to Tammy Halstead. Tammy announced that they are trying different platforms for online registrations. So far they have tried Sign Up Genius, Better World and Ticket Stripe. Ticket Stripe has had the most success but they will continue to research and test other platforms until they find the best one that will suit our needs, especially as we grow and continue to do more online events. **Virginia Quilt Museum:** President Karen Brewster asked members to keep checking the Virginia Quilt Museum's website for everything they have going on. The Harrisonburg quilts are to be hung in the museum this year. They are also doing their Mini Quilt Challenge which is a 15" x 15" quilt or favorite quilt block that can be displayed. If you do not want to keep it, they will accept as a donation and sell in the gift shop. This helps them to raise money for the museum.

**ELECTIONS:** Debi Harding announced that the positions of President and Secretary will need to be filled for 2025. Elections will need to be voted on at the October meeting. If interested please reach out to a Board member.

- Visit the local guilds to promote VCQ. If you can't go in person, contact another VCQ quilter who is a member of that guild to promote VCQ. Area Reps are vital to building our membership.

- Attend VCQ board meetings every other month on Zoom. (About one hour.)

- Attend VCQ annual board retreat the second Saturday in January at Deb Schupp's house in Culpeper or on Zoom. (9am-4pm)

Benefits to being on the VCQ Board

- Being part of the decision making process that drives VCQ.

- Knowing what is planned for VCQ well before it is made public.

- Providing feedback from your area members to the board on issues or concerns that are important to them. Keeping that line of communication open.

- Making life-long quilting friends.

- Use of VCQ's Zoom account for personal reasons. (To connect with family and friends, not to run a business.)

Some of you have served on the VCQ Board in a variety of positions and know the pleasure of having quilting friends you can call on.

#### VIRTUAL PROGRAMS CHAIR NEEDED
