Support of the Virginia Quilt Museum The 1856 Society

As you know, VCQ sends a donation to the Virginia Quilt Museum (VQM) annually to support the installation of quilt exhibits. The VCQ board feels it is important to continue to do this in part because members of VCQ were instrumental in founding the Museum and because the VQM mission is in direct alignment with our own mission.

In an effort to create a core group of sustaining supporters for the physical facility of the VQM, the 1856 Society has been revived. Donors' names will be engraved on a permanent plaque which will hang in the Museum. VCQ's name is on the original plaque – why not add your name, too. The name of the 1856 Society is based on the date of construction, 1856, of the Warren-Sipe House in Harrisonburg which houses the Museum. The funds raised will be used for the general operating budget which includes the ongoing costs of care/repairs to the building. The hope is to create a fund from which the organization can look to the future.

MINUTES OF THE LAST GENERAL MEETING

June 11,2022 VCQ In-person Meeting, Culpeper, Virginia

Meeting brought to order by President Deb Schupp at 12:50 PM

President: Deb Schupp welcomed 41 attendees to the first in-person meeting since November of 2019. VCQ has been conducting Zoom meetings for the past 30 months. VCQ will continue to host in-person meetings and Zoom classes and "come quilt with me" sessions. The board is meeting every other month on Zoom. Any members wanting to use Zoom for their own use, is permitted to use it. Please check the monthly schedule so that you aren't interrupting any scheduled events. In July, Augusta Cole is providing a Zoom class for VCQ. See our web site for details to sign up. Condolences to a long- time member Jo Foudriat on the recent passing of her husband.

Deb has announced that she will be chairing the next Celebration 2024. The date for this event has been moved up a week to April 18-24,2024. This was done to avoid competition with the Paducah, Ky. show. Phyliss Mondak will be procuring the teachers. We will need other members to help with many jobs in the months to come. We need a brochure volunteer to get ready for registration in only a year away. Please see Deb to help.

VCQ is hosting "Come Quilt With Me" Zoom events every month. The third Saturday is set aside for this and anyone can be a volunteer to host this! Great experience and an easy free lesson included! Deb Schupp hosts the first Tuesday of the month from 1-4. Learn how to host free and get a group going with quilt friends!

Treasurer: Wendy Collier presented the treasurer's report. She passed out print-outs of the report for the membership to follow. So far this year we have a \$2,000 deficit. Celebration showed only a \$500 deficit. This was less than expected due to covid issues. VCQ has \$30,098.95 in two accounts. A motion to approve the report was made by Betty Blessin, Seconded by Karin McElvein. Approved by all in attendance.

Membership: Faye Hannah stated we have 190 current members. She is reminding everyone to keep advertising VCQ in your local guilds and remind previous members to rejoin!

Programs: Debi Harding is our worker to procure teachers for our general meetings. We are currently looking at Virginia Beach as our next meeting site on October 8. Please contact her if there is a local teacher you would like to have from that area.

Elizabeth Gibson is the worker for our virtual class teachers. July 9 is our next virtual class with Augusta Cole. We need 15 students for the class and can take more! Please go to VCQ website to sign up.

Charity projects: Karin McElvein recently took 26 quilts to the ALS hopes and dreams organization. She also took numerous bassinett covers to Norfolk General NICU. She passed out numerous (27) kits at Celebration. The directions for these projects are on our website. She urges everyone to please put a label on your quilt before donating it. She was also recently given a great deal of free patterns that she has placed on the back table.

At the last meeting I tallied all the class evaluations on what classes YOU would like to see. Equally Overwhelmingly, Scraps, Pre-Cuts and Modern came in as the top three. So, we are offering those 3 classes at this meeting.

Workshop A: Crazy Christmas Trees by Debby Coleman





Crazy Christmas Trees by Karla Alexander

Workshop Description:

This is a quick, easy and fun pattern which you can use to make a table runner, banner or quilt with these whimsical trees. Remember trees aren't just for Christmas – you could make a runner for every occasion.

Skill Level Required: Beginner / Intermediate

Supply List:

Sewing Machine Rotary cutter Cutting Mat Basic sewing kit Fabric Markers which show on all fabrics. 45 degree ruler (at least 10") or Creative Grids Spider Web ruler Magic clips (if you have them) **Note:** Due to limited outlets, Irons, board and mat will be provided by VCQ for the class

Fabric Requirements:

8 - 10" X 10" square for trees
8 - 11" X 14" rectangles for background
1 ½ yd fabric for backing and binding
Batting (17" x 44")
Scrap paper & pencil

Each student must purchase Crazy Christmas Trees Pattern - download available from Cut Loose Press Company \$4.00

About your teacher:

Debby only began quilting when she retired from life as a lawyer and became a military wife 13 years ago. She joined Tidewater Quilters Guild 8 years ago and has been busy ever since !! She enjoys all aspects of quilting and has taught collage quilts, English Paper Piecing and several scrappy projects.

Debby is currently TQG's Quilt Show Chair, but has previously held positions as both 1st and 2nd Vice President as well as President. During the lockdown she was also responsible for programs and workshops on zoom and is especially proud of bringing Kaffe Fassett to the Guild to lecture during that time.

Workshop B: Disappearing 4-Patch with Karin McElvein



Workshop Description: This pattern is made from those great 5" charm packs, or you can cut your own. The 2 charm packs of 40 each will make 20 blocks approximately 8 inches finished. The quilts pictured above will be @ 32" x 40" without borders. There is no pattern. To see one made, Go on You Tube and search for Missouri Star Quilt Company. Skill Level Required: Beginner

Supply List:

Rotary mat, I use a 12" square one that turns. If you don't have one I would bring 2 mats and you can place the smaller one on the larger one and turn it.

Rulers: One 6" square for squaring up the 5" squares. Not always needed, but different manufactures squares are not always cut the same. *If using charm squares, you could do this at home before class*. One 12-inch ruler at least 4" wide that can be used with a rotary cutter.

Rotary Cutter, thread, sewing machine with 1/4" foot. Scissors and pins etc.

Fabric Requirements:

If you are cutting your own 5" squares PLEASE do so before class.

1 charm pack containing at least 40 - 5" squares. This may be a variety pack or one solid color if you want to make just a two-color quilt. You could also cut 40- 5" squares from any fabric you choose or different fabrics. 1 charm pack containing at least 40 - 5" squares of background fabric. You could also cut 40- 5" squares from yardage.

Border fabric and binding: 1 ¹/₂ yards. I usually wait and choose this once the top is made.

About your teacher:

Karin has been quilting since 1997 which she took up after retiring from teaching. Since then she has made over 100 quilts, many wearables and quilted purses. She has been teaching a variety of many of these techniques many times. She lives in Norfolk and has taught previously for VCQ and The Tidewater Quilters Guild. She also taught in the now closed quilt shop, What's Your Stitch and Stuff. Many of her quilts have won ribbons at local quilt shows. Karin has often made the disappearing four patch as it makes a fast and easy baby quilt that looks much more difficult than it is. One should be able to almost finish the quilt top in the 5-hour class.

Workshop C: Modern Scrappy Improv Sampler - Quilt As You Go by Noreen Skiles





Workshop Description:

Use your scraps, small orphan blocks, selvedges, and scrap batting to make either a table runner of 5 blocks (17" x 64") or a wall hanging of 9 blocks. You will learn 5 improv techniques with ideas for several variations. All of it will be tied together with a neutral fabric that complements your scrap choices. I will be demonstrating the table runner, but there will be written directions for finishing it as a small quilt. I will teach a **Ouilt As You Go** technique with wider sashing, as well as teaching the add-a-border technique for QAYG. The QAYG techniques can be transferred to any quilt project to make quilting on a domestic machine easier.

Skill Level Required: All -Beginner, Intermediate, Advanced **Supply List:**

Ruler that will be used to square blocks to 11" inches - you can choose a different size but will need to make your own adjustments.

Walking foot for your machine is most helpful Usual cutting and sewing machine supplies for piecing Purple school glue stick (not clear glue)

Fabric Requirements:

Decide if you are doing a 5 block table runner (17 x 54) or a 9 block small quilt (41 x 41).

You should cut the backing fabric (and batting if you are not using scraps of batting) before class, and if you want to precut the sashing and border fabrics it will give you more sewing time in class.

Please note color coded for table runner or 9 small block quilt:

- Fabric scraps-You may want to limit it to two complimentary colors, one contrasting color and a neutral-Bring plenty to play with. (I have had people use jelly rolls as well)
- A couple of orphan blocks on the small side (about 4—5 inch square) OPTIONAL
- 4 or 5 fabric selvages that are about 14" or more in length. You can also use heavy ribbon or left-over binding pieces.

•Scrap batting strips—enough to fill in your square backings or batting cut to the size you need. I will still demonstrate my technique for using your batting scraps. You can just cut batting squares to 12. - 12.5" from whole batting. You will need to cut strips for the sashing and border listed below.

- For the 9-block quilt you will need 2 strips (3" wide) x (37" long) and 2 that are 3" x 44 inches long (for the border). You will also need: 6 strips that are 1.5" to be 11" long and 2 strips 1.5 " by 37" (for sashing).
- For the table runner—2 strips 2" x 11" long and 2 strips that are 3" x 65" long (for the borders). You will also need 4 strips that are 1.5" x 11" and for just the small quilt, one that is 1.5" by 37" (for sashing).

- Backing fabric for blocks cut to 12 12.5" (5 for a table runner and 9 for a small quilt)
- Coordinating focus or neutral fabric for sashing and binding Approximately 1 yard for the table runner and 1 1/2 yards for the wall quilt. Cut some of your neutral sashing fabric cut into strips to join your blocks on the front that are 5" wide. Before cutting them to length sizes, fold them in half and iron, like for binding.

For a 9-block quilt you will need: 6 strips that are folded to 2.5" wide by 11" long and 2 strips that are folded to 2.5" wide by 37" long

For a table runner or small quilt, you will need: 4 strips that are folded to 2.5" wide by 11" and for just the small quilt, one that is folded to 2.5" wide by 37" long

The rest of your neutral fabric is for the border cut to 3.5" wide and:

For the 9-block quilt you will need 2 strips 37" long and 2 that are 44 inches

For the table runner—2 strips 11" long and 2 strips that are 65" long

• Back sashing and back border fabric— about 1 yard. For a 9 block quilt you will need: 6 strips that are 2.5" to be 11" long and 2 strips 2.5" by 37"

For a table runner: 4strips that are 2.5" x 11" and for just the small quilt, one that is 2.5" by 37"

Norene Skiles, a retired school library media specialist, began sewing as a young girl, and has never stopped. She primarily sewed clothing until the birth of her first grandchild 25 years ago. She made her first quilt in 1996 and joined the Tidewater Quilt Guild shortly after that. Her quilting style has evolved over the years from patterns and traditional quilting to modern Improv with a scrappy focus. She loves to incorporate technology into her quilting and as many fabrics as possible. She now lectures on Zoom and in person on various facets of quilting, leads the Modern Quilt Group for TQG, and she teaches scrap quilting and Quilt As You Go techniques in person and on Zoom.

Workshop D: Come Quilt with Me

Bring your own hand or machine project, ALS Charity or bassinet covers to work on as you sit and quilt with other members and experience wonderful fellowship.



Lodging Accommodations

Reserve and share a hotel room of your choice. There are so many hotels to choose from in Virginia Beach and Norfolk. You can stay near the church facility (just off I-64 and North Hampton Blvd. where there is a Quality Suites Lake Wright-Norfolk Airport, or a Double Tree by Hilton – Norfolk Airport). Also, in the nearby Virginia Beach Towne Center there are lots of new, modern hotels, shopping and restaurants or you may choose to go down further (@ 5-15 miles) to the beach.
