MINUTES OF THE LAST GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

VCQ General Membership Meeting Gloucester, VA

Saturday June 10, 2023 The meeting was called to order at 12:35 by President Karen Brewster. President Brewster welcomed everyone along with our 5 new members attending their first meeting and 1 guest.

Announcements: President Brewster asked for corrections to the March minutes. None were noted. Kathy Gray made a motion to accept them as posted. Jan White seconded the motion. The motion carried. President Brewster announced there were cards for an ill member and a sympathy card for Debby Kratovil whose daughter unexpectedly passed away.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Treasurer: Wendy Collyer announce we have \$18,554 in General Checking account, \$16,461 in Money Market account. We are currently about \$5,000 ahead, but nothing has been accounted for yet for this June meeting. There was \$2,000 donated to Vi Graves Scholarship Fund. Wendy explained that the fund is used to help someone who wants to go to Celebration pay for part or all of it if they are having financial difficulties. Wendy is going to email the financial report out to membership (she was not able to have available at this meeting).

Community Service: Karin McElvein was not present. Kits were made available for members to take and put together for ALS quilts. Members can return at the next meeting as well as any ALS or Bassinette Covers they have made.

Membership: Faye Hannah announced we have 223 current members. We have had 50 new members join so far in 2023.

Celebration: Deb Schupp announced that the online brochure is with Mary Grogan to link to the VCQ website. Our Facebook and Website has a list of the teachers that will be there. On July 1st the full brochure will go live online, on Aug 1st registration will open to VCQ members, and on Sept 1st registration will open to non-members. There is a Lottery Block for purchase (\$5 for 2 blocks). Make the blocks and turn them in at next meeting or at Celebration. The blocks will be raffled off. Membership was reminded that we are also doing the 40th Anniversary Ruby Quilt Challenge for Celebration-make a Red & White quilt to show.

Newsletter: Kathy Gray announced the deadline for the next newsletter is August 15th.

In-Person Programs: Debi Harding announced the next in person meeting will be Oct 14th (2nd Saturday). Sherry Whitford is looking for a location in the Richmond area (Mechanicsville) and we are planning on 3 teachers. June 2024 is secured for Harrisonburg.

Virtual Programs: Elizabeth Gibson was not present. President Karen Brewster announced that Catherine Redford will be presenting her class "Walking Foot Quilting & Big Stitch" on September 9th (2nd Saturday). Registration is open and the cost is \$50 for members, \$60 for non-members. The minimum needed to hold the class is 12 and the maximum is 20. Class will be held 10-5, it is a 6 hour class with an our for lunch.

Old Business Kelly Zuber-The Slumber Party is going to be on Aug 19th from 6pm - 12am on Zoom. The cost is \$5 for to pay for the Zoom slot. If you want to have a group of friends do it together, only one person needs to register for the Zoom slot. Kelly does ask that everyone be on the honor system and purchase the Harrisonburg Quilt Pattern from the Quilt Museum. The sale of the patterns is going to support the museum. We have 100 zoom slots that can be used. There will be specials guests popping in, prizes, and recipes.

NEW BUSINESS: President Karen Brewster announced that Mary Grogan is stepping down from being web mistress on 12/31/2023. Mary has been doing the job for 10 years and is currently dealing with some health issues and she needs to concentrate on that. Multiple members volunteering to do different parts of it would make the job much easier to do. Mary is currently working on switching us over to Mailchimp which will make email blast much easier to do. She is also looking into a new web platform that will have better virtual programming built in.

Reminders: Come Quilt with Me is on Zoom the 1st Tuesday from 1pm-4pm and the 3rd Saturday from 9am - 12pm. Area Reps are still needed for the Southwest, Shenandoah Valley and Northern VA. October Elections will need to vote on Vice President, Treasurer, and Historian/Documentation.

Meeting was adjourned at 1:35 and members returned to their classes.

COMING TO A COMPUTER NEAR YOU VIRTUAL PROGRAMS Elizabeth Gibson

September 9 is our next exciting online class, "Walking Foot Quilting, Beyond the Basics" with Catherine Redford. The class is full but contact Elizabeth Gibson programs@vcq.org to go on a waiting list. Those of you signed up, please see the supply list below. The Zoom link to attend the class will be sent to enrolled students several days before class.

Walking Foot Quilting – Beyond the Basics Supply list:

Materials:

- ten 10" squares solid color fabric (not batiks)
- two 10" square pieced blocks of any design, or two more solid squares (not batiks)
- six 10" squares low loft cotton batting Sewing machine threads for quilting e.g., 50 wt or 60 wt. 2 ply cotton threads 8wt. perle cotton/12 wt. thread for hand stitching

Equipment:

Size 1 safety pins for basting quilt sandwiches,

scissors,

chalk pencil,

ruler,

low-tac painters' tape,

Size 80 sharp machine needle,

#24 chenille hand sewing needle,

paper and pen for notes.

Sewing machine required with either a Walking Foot or Dual feed System. I recommend an open toed sole plate for maximum visibility. Have all your sewing machine feet handy. You never know what you might choose to use! If your machine comes with a hands-free system (knee lift) make sure to have it available, even if you don't normally use it.

PDF of handout will be supplied to all class participants

VCQ would like to have a few members who would be willing to moderate online classes. This involves contacting the teacher before the class to ask if she has any specific tech needs and then contacting the VCQ programs to see how we can help the teacher. On the day of the class the moderator acts as the host or cohost of the class, monitors the chat box, takes attendance and assists the students in the class. Watch for another virtual class offering in November. Once the schedule is firm, we will announce it by email blast and on our VCQ Facebook page.

Block Lotto

For Celebration! 2024 we look forward to commemorating 40 years of VCQ Quilting Friendships! This colorful "Friendship Scrap Block" is a perfect choice for the Block Lotto Patch. The block is $12 \frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished and is constructed as a four patch. Each kit will include clear sewing instructions and 24 off-white triangles, enough to make two blocks. These triangles create a border between the corners and the center of the block (see photo). Each of the four corner triangles should utilize a different bright colorful fabric, prints or tone-on-tone. Trading fabrics with VCQ friends is encouraged and adds to the scrappiness. Just remember that the block must be sewn with a scant ¹/₄" seam allowance so all the parts fit together properly. The blocks will be raffled off at Celebration! 2024. SewTangle by Sweetie Davis

SewTangle, owned and operated by Marian and Dave Dabay, is a delightful little quilt shop in a residential neighborhood at 798 Chesapeake Drive, in Whitestone VA.

SewTangle is open Thursday, Friday, and Saturday from 10:00-4:00, and by appointment by calling 804-807-1197. Guest shoppers are welcomed with a smile. SewTangle stocks about 1,000 bolts of fabric from Northcott, Robert Kaufman, Figo, Riley Blake, Clothworks, In the Beginning, Blank, StudioE, Free Spirit, a little Tula Pink and Kaffe Fassett, and others. Marian's style is somewhat romantic, a little bit modern, maybe quirky, and bright, colorful and fun. SewTangle has a good selection of white-on-whites as well as a great selection of precuts, especially 5" charm packs and fat quarter bundles. You'll see wide backs, Batiks, panels, Minky, rulers and other sewing and quilting tools.

Marian and Dave have been married almost 40 years. They are retirees from careers in the computer industry. They opened SewTangle in April 2021. It temporarily closed in the fall of 2022 because of an unforeseen medical issue. Good health has returned so Marian and Dave re-opened the shop in June 2023.

Marian has been quilting for about 10 years. She began by writing her own quilt patterns. She learned that in order to sell her patterns, she needed to make at least three quilts from each pattern. She made one quilt while writing the pattern, a second to test the pattern and then gave the pattern to someone else to test. She found it expensive to buy the fabric for three quilts, so thought that she might be able to buy fabric wholesale. Marian started selling fabric on Etsy right about the time Covid hit. She says that sales through Etsy were successful; however, her love of fabric and quilting led she and Dave to open SewTangle a year later.

SewTangle works with Toys for Tots. Quilters are welcome to come in and pick up a Christmas stocking kit for \$5, then make the stocking, fill it with toys and bring it back to the shop to be donated to Toys for Tots. SewTangle will give the doner a \$5 gift certificate in return.

This past April, Jan Farrow and I attended Quilt Week in Paducah, KY. We had a wonderful time and learned so much! We enjoyed meeting the vendors and having many of our questions answered. We purchased some great tools and accessories to enhance our quilting. We took three classes while we were there.

We took Kailua Cabins from Marti Michell. It was Log Cabin themed blocks. In this class we used a ruler created by Marti. We learned how to cut all the pieces for four blocks at one time. This was a very efficient use of fabric and our time.

Another class we took was Free-Form Twists from Karen Eckmeier. In this class we created beautiful blocks by cutting free-form curves and then piecing them together. Karen has a book written about this method as well as a great YouTube video showing the technique.

Our third class was Get En Point with HRTs with Shereece Nicole. Here we created a tablerunner utilizing Shereece's technique for making half rectangle triangles. It wasn't at all like we thought and it was fun to learn!

We attended an All-Star Review with several of the teachers who were offering classes throughout the week.

A highlight of our trip was visiting Hancocks of Paducah. It was an amazing store and of course, we purchased fabric! The store was extremely large, very organized and the staff was friendly and helpful.

One other high spot in our trip was visiting the National Quilt Museum. There were several exhibits including one honoring Kaffe Fassett, showcasing several of his quilts.

There were pop-up stores and exhibits around town. We visited the Cherrywood Pop-Up shop as well as their exhibit showing their recent Graffiti Challenge.

Our husbands made the trip with us and they enjoyed exploring the Paducah area while we attended the events. Paducah is a beautiful town with many things to see and do. If you get a chance to visit Paducah or attend Quilt Week, Jan and I would highly recommend it!

Tips and Tricks

Tip 1: Routines Boost Your Quilting Efficiency

For those of us who work, have families, *and* try to stay crafty, efficiency is essential. Establishing routines can help you make the most of your time.

For example, let's say your sewing space is often cluttered, making it hard to find things you need. (I know mine sometimes is!) How much time do you estimate you spend each week hunting for a particular scrap of fabric or specialty tool? Be honest: Have you ever had to repurchase something you lost, only to discover the original later? That can add up to a lot of wasted time and money.

In this example, a tidy-up routine could make a huge difference. First, choose a time of day that coincides with your less-creative hours (for me, that's at night, when it's dark out and I'm tired). Commit to a small amount of tidy-up time (10 minutes is a good start) and set a timer (this one is my fave). When the timer goes off, stop — or if you're at a bad place to pause, set another timer for five more minutes. Stopping is key; if you clean non-stop the first time and get worn out, you'll feel disincentivized to make it into a daily routine.

Tip 2: Decide Once

As you begin to sort through your fabrics you have only two decisions to make: keep or get rid of it. Don't allow yourself to have a "maybe" box. And only keep what you can reasonably store in the space you have available. If you don't love it, you probably won't use it in a quilt in the near future.

Tip 3: Use strip piecing techniques when possible. This is not only more efficient, but it tends to be more accurate as well. I always analyze a pattern first to see if I can make it more efficient by cutting strips of fabric instead of individual squares, for instance. I just ran across this on a complex block for a pattern where it had me cutting out individual squares for 9-patches. I made them with strips instead and they turned out perfect.

Workshop A: A Scrappy Delight with Augusta Cole Sewing Machine Project Class Skill Level: Basic Sewing Skills



Supply List: - Fabric and Notions Required:

Scraps, Scraps and more Scraps Sewing machine and regular sewing supplies Extension cord and power strip Thread and filled bobbins – gray or neutral Rotary mat and cutter (sharp) including rulers Triangle ruler – either an Omnigrid or a Creative Grids Half Square 4 -in 1- Triangle Ruler, I will have some of these available for \$20. A large ruler to square up your blocks. Irons and pressing surface will be provided in general area or room

Fabrics for A Scrappy Delight

Bring your strip scraps! Study the photo, I like the mixture of colors in this quilt, so use what you have. For the center squares in this quilt we will be using 6-inch strips, they should be different widths, and we will sew them together with our background strips. Lots of strips, so enjoy using lots of scraps!

4 yards of background fabric – I used white for my colors to pop. Cut at least 2 strips selvage to selvage, 6 inches wide X width of fabric, bring remainder of fabric to class.

Depending on how large your quilt finishes, I recommend waiting to see what your backing fabric needs to be for this scrappy quilt.

Study the photo, the vertical sashing strips are all different widths, but cut 4.5" wide.

The sashing strips going horizonal are also different widths and are also cut 4.5" wide.

Bring lots of strips! Sharing our stash will also be fun. Variety!

About your teacher:

I began my quilting career in North Carolina 35 years ago. I was a member of the Pamlico River Quilters Guild and in 1982 I was asked to be on the board of directors for the North Carolina Quilt Symposium. In 1984, I moved to Richmond and became active in the local quilting groups, eventually serving as President of the Virginia Consortium of Quilters, a statewide quilting group.

Currently, I offer a variety of workshops, many of them being snappy, scrappy classes. I give lectures that include my collection of quilts and my love for the art of quilt making.

Workshop B: "Collage Quilt" with Julie Haymes

We have chosen a Laura Heine pattern with three minis on the same pattern. Each are 16" x 20", which has a pincushion, a dress form and a sewing machine. We will all be making the sewing machine. Grab some Steam-A-Seam 2, some popping florals, a bit of background and join us for a class sure to tickle your funny bone. Julie will be your guide, as we cut, adhere, and enjoy the creativity that collage has to offer. Basic process by which you will create the base of your collage and how to embellish it with florals and fun stuff.



Hand Class: No cutting mat, No rotary cutter, And Please-No Cutting anything ahead of <u>time</u> Skill Level: Beginner+

Supply List:

- Scraps are so small, you can use lots of little pieces (some florals) for the entire quilt
- Keep in mind smaller motifs must be used to keep preparation for the smaller quilt
- 20" x 24" piece of Pattern Ease or purchase from teacher for \$1
- 1 yard of steam-a-seam 2 or purchase package from teacher for \$6
- #2 pencil
- Medium, fine point scissors, Karen K Buckley perfect scissors, good for applique & fussy cutting work great.
- Small and Large fabric scissors

- Applique pressing cloth or Precision Fusing Cloth if you have one or parchment paper
- Black sharpie yes regular thick one (not fine point)
- Black Fabric for sewing machine
- Backing fabric 20" x 24"
- VCQ will provide irons and boards for fusing

Kit Fee: \$25 for your Laura Hein pattern, \$6 for Steam-A-Seam 2 package -(5) 9" x 12" sheets and \$1 for a piece of Pattern Ease, which is thin see thru interfacing (20" x 24") can be purchased from the instructor.

About your teacher:

Julie Haymes with Heather Stocker are the new owners of Quilting Adventures. They've both been quilting for over 20 years. At the end of May, they closed the shop for a complete renovation and re-opened 3 weeks later. Along with the shop offering classes, they now offer Long-arming Services. Heather had a long arm business in her home for 10 years (Bon Air Quilts) and made T-shirt quilts. Julie was her employee for a year before they bought the shop.

Workshop C: Rolling Nine Patch with Diane Phillips

This quilt can be done with two fabrics or scrappy. If you do a scrappy quilt, make sure your "Background" has a "relationship" so it is somewhat cohesive. Think one color family that will not be part of your "Focus". In the sample I used many black and white prints as my Background, where my "Focus" was tone on tone or solids.

The quilt is constructed using three different double nine patch blocks.

You will have a confident understanding on how to finish the quilt when you leave the class.



Sewing Machine Project Class Skill Level: Beginner Friendly Supply List for Queen Size Rolling Nine Patch

Three simple nine patch blocks when carefully put together give the impression of curves. You can create a quilt using two high contrast fabrics or you can go with a "planned scrap" approach.

Fabric Requirements:

Focus Fabric 3 ¹/₂ yards Background Fabric 6 yards Coordinating Thread

Other Requirements for Class:

Sewing Machine with new needle and full bobbin Rotary Cutter with fresh blade and cutting mat Acrylic Rulers that you are comfortable using for cutting I use a 6" x 12" and a 6" x 24"

Prior Cutting to Assure Success – not required but very helpful

From your Focus Fabric

40 strips 1 ¹/₄" x width of fabric 10 strips 2" x width of fabric 4 strips 2 ³/₄" x width of fabric

From your Background Fabric

4 strips 3 ¹/₂" x 84" cut on length-wise grain*
35 strips 1 ¹/₄" x width of fabric
5 strips 2 ¹/₄" x width of fabric
8 strips 2" x width of fabric
64 squares 2 ³/₄" x 2 ³/₄"
120 rectangles 2 ³/₄" x 5 ³/₄"
36 squares 5 ³/₄" x 5 ³/₄"
*Cut first (if you are making the entire quilt)
Don't forget to label your pieces.
Even if you get a third of this precut you will go home with a lot done.

Most important – come and have fun!
