#### VIRGINIA CONSORTIUM OF QUILTERS Meeting Minutes November 8, 2008

The meeting was called to order by Marty Moon, President. Thanks were offered to the VA Foothills Guild for hosting the meeting. Patty Marshall drew a ticket for the first door prize of the afternoon. General announcements included the Foothills Guild raffle quilt, lost and found outside the vendor's room, and notification of a High Tea event at the VA Quilt Museum at 1 PM on Dec. 6.

Reports: Since minutes of the August meeting were unavailable, a motion was made and approved to dispense with the reading of the minutes. Elaine Myers presented the treasurer's report. There were no questions, so it will be filed for audit. The membership chair reported 313 members and reminded members that renewals are due. We had 2 new members at the meeting and 2-3 more attending for the first time. Publicity chair reported that more fliers are available for area reps and quilt shops. Our web mistress has moved to Maryland, and we happily report that Mary Grogan of Culpeper will take over that position. The next newsletter deadline is Jan. 10. Cheryl thanks Dianne Reasons for compiling an abbreviated version of the newsletter for the November meeting. Planning for Celebration 2010 is underway. The committee reports 6 teachers confirmed. They have designed their logo, are planning a visit to the 4-H center, and will be providing reminders at each meeting. Cathy Tyler, Programs, reports that due to lower attendance, 2 classes did not fill. She is currently scheduling teachers for the March meeting. Cathy steps down from her position at the end of the year, and a new program chair is needed. Debi Harding of the Celebration 2008 committee announced that 1 bag and several neck wallets are still available for sale. Karin McElvin's Facilities report stated that the Williamsburg quilters will be looking for a meeting location for March. A location is needed for May 09, possibly in Northern VA. August 09 will be held in Monterey, VA. Kitty

Bull explained that Monterey is a different type of location for VCQ. There are no hotels, so there is no one location for all of us to stay. Instead, there are several inns and lots of B & B's and vacation homes. You may want to bring your spouse, and plan to spend the whole weekend. We expect to hold our meeting at the Highland Center. The town is excited to host us. Check out the Highland County website, and make a reservation NOW. The Montvale Inn has 1<sup>st</sup> level rooms for those who may have physical impairments.

After additional door prizes, the meeting proceeded with Old Business. First was the election of 3 officers. Since the slate was not published in the newsletter, a motion was made, seconded and approved to suspend the rules regarding publication of the slate. The following candidates were presented: Debi Harding for President, Susan Price for Secretary and Joan McGowan for Historian. It was moved, seconded and passed that the slate be accepted by acclamation.

New Business proceeded with the presentation of a completed quilt to outgoing President Marty Moon. Quilt members made blocks which were assembled into a top by board members and was in turn quilted by Elaine Myers. Charlotte Veregge made the suggestion that gifts to the VQM be made in Ray Koch's name in recognition of his enjoyment of quilting. Michaele Walsh reported that Vicki Murphy contributed 25 quilt blocks for the VA Memorial Quilt Project. Additional blocks should be 12 1/2" unfinished in red, white and blue. The board will have their annual retreat Jan. 10-11. Give your ideas and suggestions to board members; meeting locations for 2010 are needed.

Following additional door prizes and a reminder of show and tell at the end of the day, the meeting was adjourned.

#### **Crustless Quiche**

When the VCQ Board held its annual retreat, it was again not only time to slave away over mounds of paperwork, but it was a chance to engage in some serious culinary adventures. This recipe was hit number one, and Mary was kind enough to share it with us. We hope you enjoy it as much as we did.

This recipe is quick and simple to prepare, and is extremely adaptable for any season. The flour in the batter gives it a bit of a crust without the work (and calories) of making one. Be creative!

Serves 8

PRE-HEAT oven to 350 degrees

STIR TOGETHER

1/2 cup flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons fresh herbs (or 1/2 tsp
dried) of your choice

THOROUGHLY MIX flour mixture into 1 cup evaporated milk or light cream using a wire whisk

BEAT in five eggs

STIR IN ...

1 cup cooked vegetables (chard, asparagus, squash, etc)1 cup coarsely grated mild cheese of your choice

POUR into a 9-inch pie plate, lightly buttered

BAKE in center of oven for 35-45 minutes, or until pie is set (it will rise when it cooks).

COOL 5-10 minutes before serving.

#### Class A: Pillow Toss with Karen Dumont

Skill level: intermediate to advanced

Machine class.

Make one of six decorative pillows for your home or to give as a gift using Karen's latest pattern, Pillow Toss. The class will focus on simple machine applique techniques as well as easy machine quilting techniques. If you are not interested in applique Karen will also show how to incorporate easy blocks in the pillow to coordinate with any quilt.

#### **Supply List**

- Sewing Machine with zig zag foot, embroidery foot and a feature to drop feed dogs
- Basic sewing supplies (if you have black thread bring it along for practicing machine quilting)
- 1/4 yard fusible web
- ½ yard batting
- ½ yard muslin

Fabric requirements for pillow will be listed on pattern. However, if you do not have it before coming to class please purchase the following:

#### Square pillow:

<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yard for backing and flange (border) 16"x 16" center fabric and cornerstones 1, 2 ½" x wof fabric for sashing 19"x19" piece of batting 19"x19" piece of muslin

#### Rectangular pillow:

2, 6 1/2"x 8 1/2" rectangle for background

2, 2 ½"x wof of fabric for sashing 2, 3/2"x wof fabric for flange (border) ½ yard fabric for backing 24"x24" piece of batting 24"x24" piece of muslin

#### Class B: Beautiful Baltimore: Eagle and Flag with Sara Madson

Skill Level: Intermediate

Hand class.

Required Kit Fee: \$35.00 contains pattern, pre-washed and color tested fabrics, thread, needles, pins, and marking pens.

This Baltimore style album block which was hand drawn by Sara was inspired by blocks in several of the antique album quilts. Many times similar blocks were used in the center of the quilts. Students will learn back basting, reverse appliqué, inking, and Sara's unique "channel roses" during the class. The finished block can be added to the student's own Baltimore Style Album Quilt (new or existing) or she can mat and frame it as a picture when

completed. 14" design area, 15" to 16" finished square.



#### Supplies:

- · small sharp-to-the-point scissors
- a thimble (if you use one for applique)

#### Optional:

- · extra lighting
- magnifier
- · light table

Sara Madson has been making quilts since 1976 and can document four generations of quilt making in her own family. She has taught quilt making since 1983 at various places around the country, moving frequently with her military husband. Most of her quilts are made with a hand held needle simply because she loves handwork. #### Class C: Photo Holder Wall Hanging with Karen Lee Carter

Skill Level: All levels

Machine class

Pattern: \$10.00 (includes instructions for variations of project in other sizes)


Make a quilted wallhanging that holds and displays up to 14 standard 4" x 6" photos. Hangs vertically or horizontally (depending on fabric selection) Many creative techniques and ideas for embellishing and personalizing your wallhanging will also be presented. This fun and easy project makes a unique and memorable gift! approximate size -35" x 38"

#### Supply List

•	Center blocks	1/2 yard
•	Outer border	1/2 yard
•	Sashing	1/2 yard

#### Class D: Knit Lace Ouilt Edging with Bess Haile

Skill level: Advanced Beginner You *must* know how to cast on, knit and purl and bind off, but if you can knit a scarf you can knit lace edgings.

Hand class



Materials fee: \$10

Adorn your hand sewn projects with lace you knit yourself. Beautiful knitted lace trim can be knit out of all sorts of fibers from luxury to bargain, from fine gauge silk to sturdy cotton. Knitted lace trim can be narrow, wide, crisp or draping and because knitted lace is a small project you can carry it with you. Once you get the hang of it, it can be addictive. Knitted lace can also be applied to hand made sweaters and other garments to give store bought clothes a custom look.



Students in this class will learn how to select the correct needles for the yarn they're using, how to read written directions, how to read a chart and how to graft the ends of their knitted lace together so that the seam is almost invisible. They will learn to knit several different lace patterns.

Supplies:

Bring size 3 and size 7 or 8 knitting needles.

Bess Haile: Bess Haile is a Virginia girl whose romance with fiber began at age 7 with a fully working, hand cranked, toy Singer sewing machine. Though sewing was her first love, she flirted with knitting at various times over the years and in recent years she succumbed to temptation and declared herself a knitter. Many sweaters, socks, hats and mittens later she found a less expensive way to acquire lavish novelty yarns - hand spinning. She has exhibited her work at various fiber fairs including the Montpelier and the Maryland Sheep and Wool Festival. She teaches knitting and spinning to innocent bystanders browsing in fiber shops and at regularly scheduled classes as well. A library director in real life, she has developed a story program that combines folk lore, economic, technological, and social history and fine motor development with hand spinning, which she offers to schools and libraries. Class E: Tool Tote with Lorraine Mooney

Skill level: All Machine class Pattern: \$3

In this class you will learn to make a 15"x15" tote that has permanent clear plastic pockets on the inside of the front and back and removable zippy plastic bag inserts in the center. You can keep your scissors, cutters, and other tools in the permanent pockets and your project fabrics and blocks in the removable zippy bag inserts. You can make extra zippy bag inserts to easily swap out your projects and have your tools ready to go. This tote is also excellent for scrapbooking and can be adapted for knitting and crochet work.

#### Supply List

- Post it notes to label pieces as your cut
- ½ yard of a fabric fo the outside and another ½ yard for the inside
- · a fat quarter for handles if not using extra from front and inside

- ¼ yard cut across the width of the fabric, not a fat quarter, for binding
- a fat quarter or 2 packages of double fold bias tape
- 1 yard of fusible interfacing, the type used for fabric bowls and boxes. If you cannot
  get it fusible, use Wonder Under or other brand of LITE fusible web and bring a little
  extra
- ½ yard of 8 to 12 mm clear plastic about \$2 a yard for the right thickness
- 3 nickle sized buttons or a 14 inch piece of sewable Velcro to attach the zippy bag pack
- Velcro or a button or snap or other closure of your choice

#### **Optional**

- 4 buttons and 4 backer buttons to reinforce the handles
- 6 one gallon size zippy bags and 6 pieces of poster board or light weight cardboard one inch less in height and width of bags. Round off corners of the poster board pieces.



#### **Equipment**

- Heavy duty sewing machine with zig zag stitch and if you have a buttonhole foot, bring that too.
- A regular needle for fabric sewing and a jeans or size 16 needle for sewing thru the plastic.
- · Bobbins wound to match your thread
- Rotary cutter, mat, and ruler. If you have a spare cutter with an old blade bring it to cut the plastic and posterboard.
- · Heavy duty scissors and an extra one for thread snipping if desired
- Cellophone tape
- · A few straight pins and a hand sewing needle and thimble
- Small board or pressing mat

Note: VCQ will provide irons

#### Pre-class Preparation

Bring the following prepared pieces to class along with the rest of the fabric, interfacing, and contrasting and matching thread as desired:

- 1. Please cut 15"x15" pieces and label as follows:
  - 2 of your outer fabric
  - 2 of your inner fabric
  - 2 of the fusible interfacing
  - 3 of the plastic
- 2. Cut for the bottom, one piece 2 1/2"x15" of your choice of fabric
- 3. Cut for the bottom lining, one piece 3 1/2"x15" of your choice of fabrics
- 4. If not using purchased double fold binding, from a fat quarter cut 10 pieces 2"x15". Place wrong side up on your ironing board and press long sides in to meet in the center and them fold in half lengthwise and press to make your double fold binding.

5. For the handles cut 2 pieces of the fusible interfacing 1 ¼" wide and one inch longer than the interfacing you cut.

Lorraine Mooney: I have been sewing for 55 years, quilting for 37 years, and teaching sewing, quilting, and machine knitting for over 20 years. I am a "retired" art teacher and had my own quilting/sewing/knitting shop for 8 years in New York. I have designed and published many quilting, sewing, and machine knitting patterns. Locally I teach for P's and Q's, Primitives and Quilts located in West Point, Virginia.

Class F: Come Quilt with Me

Sit and Stitch your own thing.
