We learned how to use break-out rooms and share screen on Zoom to share all the fabulous quilts we made this year. We also heard about Quilt Alliance. ### MINUTES OF THE LAST GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

Mechanicsville, VA

Saturday October 14, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 12:40 by President Karen Brewster. President Brewster welcomed everyone along with our 10 new members attending their first meeting and 4 guests.

Announcements: President Brewster asked for corrections to the June minutes. None were noted. Karin McElvein made a motion to accept them as posted. Susan Swett seconded the motion. The motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Treasurer: Wendy Collyer announced we have \$35,202.02 in General Checking and \$55,582.30 in Current Assets. The General Fund Net Income is \$7,475.99 and Celebration! Net Income is \$15,847.64. The motion was made by Ann Tisman to accept the report. August Cole seconded the motion and the motion was passed.

Elections: President Karen Brewster announced that we will need to vote on the slate for the positions that will begin in January 2024. Debi Harding announced the list as Vice President: Karilyn Pittman, Treasurer: Paula Hutt and Membership will again be Faye Hannah. Marty Moon made the motion to accept the slate. Jan Farrow seconded the motion. The membership voted and the motion passed to accept the slate that was presented for January 2024.

Community Service: Karin McElvein - Karin announced that she had items from ALS for quilts and encouraged members to pick some of them up to make more quilts. She dropped for 10 more quilts and found out that we came in at 3rd place for number of quilts donated over the past year. She has reminded everyone that if you make an ALS quilt, please be sure to attach the paperwork that can be found on our website to the quilt and to also put a label on the back. The label just needs your name, where you are from and the year it was made. When these are missing Karin has to put her name on the quilts and paperwork. She also reminded members that we are still taking Bassinet covers for the NICU and the instructions can be found on our website or contact her.

Membership: Faye Hannah was absent. Mary Grogan announced that we currently have 258 members and that 97 new members joined in 2023.

Celebration: Deb Schupp announced that we have 121 registered for Celebration! We can take 126 maximum. Classes are filling up fast so do not wait to register if you have not already. The dates are 18-21st of April 2024 at the 4H Center at Smith Mountain Lake. Any questions can be sent to Deb at Celebration@vcq.org. Marty Moon is heading the Block Lotto and has kits available for \$5 per kit (each kit contains 2 blocks). Karilyn and Jan are handling the silent auction and ask that member bring items to donate to Celebration! If you are not sure if it is an appropriate item to donate, send an email and ask. Silent Auction is a big fundraiser for Celebration! Door prizes are being handled by Lynn.

Newsletter: Kathy Gray announced the deadline for the next newsletter is January 15th. Write ups are welcome to be included about places or events members have attended and want to share.

In-Person Programs: Debi Harding announce that in 2024 we will meet the 2nd Saturday of March in Fredericksburg, the 2nd Saturday of June in Harrisonburg and the 2nd Saturday of October in Williamsburg.

Virtual Programs: Elizabeth Gibson was absent. President Karen Brewster announced that November 18th our virtual class is The Spin Off Quilt with Daisy Aschehoug which is a curved piecing technique. Daisy is part of the Global Quilt Connection. Write up is on the website along with sign up. The class is filling up fast. Elizabeth is working on finding a class for February.

NEW BUSINESS: Kelly Zuber was not present. President Karen Brewster announced we will be doing a Come Quilt With Me on November 5th called Deck the Holidays. It will be on Zoom and cost \$5. Kelly will have various holiday ornaments that can be made and will also do drawings for prizes.

December 31st-New Year's Eve will be a New Year's Zoom again for Final UFO for the year. This will also be \$5 and will have prizes.

President Karen Brewster also announced we are looking at doing a Block of the Month with Debby Kratovil. It would not cost anything but it would be for members only. Those who register would get a link to the block each month and the pattern is Galaxy of Stars. It is NOT a mystery, but a fun way to work on something together.

President Karen Brewster also announced that there were cards to be signed for members: a sympathy card for Phyllis Mondak's family on her passing; a sympathy card for Karen Fisher on the passing of her husband and a get well card for Carol Britt.

Virginia Quilt Museum: President Karen Brewster announced that Harrisonburg Quilt Photos will be released in a video on November 1st. They had a huge variety of fabrics in the quilts and alterations to the design that made for a large array of diversity in the pattern. VQM will also be announcing some plans for 2025 when it is the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. Keep an eye on their website.

Mary Grogan announced she still needs a replacement. It would be much easier if the job can be divided up among various people rather than one person trying to do all of it. She asked that if anyone is interested they let her know.

Kitty Bull explained the Tree of Life that was on display at the meetings so new members were aware. The VCQ Memory Tree is for VCQ members who have passed away. Each one gets their name put on a leaf and the leaf is appliquéd to the tree. Meeting was adjourned at 1:25 and members returned to their classes.

### JOIN the VCQ BOARD Be an Area Rep

Do you want VCQ to continue to grow and serve the state quilting community into the future? Then you need to step up and volunteer!

The VCQ Board is looking for members to be Area Reps for the Northern Virginia, Culpeper/Charlottesville/Lynchburg, Shenandoah Valley and Southwest areas of the state. You won't know everyone, but it's a great way to build new quilting friendships (Celebration! 2024 theme.)

Area Reps stay connected via email or Zoom and visit their local quilt guilds, so don't think you will need to tour the state. The term is usually a two-year minimum, but there is no limit.

### Duties:

- Send emails to members reminding them of upcoming events like CQWM, Zoom sew alongs, registration deadlines for Zoom and in-person workshops, etc. Set up a contact group, type a short note and send. Simple as that!

- Visit the local guilds to promote VCQ. If you can't go in person, contact another VCQ quilter who is a member of that guild to promote VCQ. Area Reps are vital to building our membership.

- Attend VCQ board meetings every other month on Zoom. (About one hour.)

- Attend VCQ annual board retreat the second Saturday in January at Deb Schupp's house in Culpeper or on Zoom. (9am-4pm)

- Being part of the decision making process that drives VCQ.

- Knowing what is planned for VCQ well before it is made public.

- Providing feedback from your area members to the board on issues or concerns that are important to them. Keeping that line of communication open.

# Forty Years in the Making by Kitty Bull

I have been tasked with the researching project of finding names of those first few folks whose idea of a Virginia state quilter's organization was begun back in early 1984. We are the Virginia Consortium of Quilters because of their vision, hard work, and perseverance 40 years ago.

We all know that the idea was sparked by Elsie Harriman after a return trip from the North Carolina Symposium that she shared with a few other quilters. A committee list of 11 enthusiastic and talented folks was formed in June of 1984. By August 26<sup>th</sup>, there were 16 committee members. And at the first formal meeting in Richmond, VA on November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 1994, from that list of 16, fourteen of those committee members met in Richmond to fan that spark into reality. By that first week in November, a general board of directors was put in place, a constitution was written, and By-Laws formed.

### Finding Your Quilty Identity

This lecture dives into the discovery of who you are as an artist as quilter. I've met many wonderful quilters who feel like they don't know what they "like." They say things like they only make quilts from kits or feel like they have to use what fabric is currently popular. There's nothing wrong with this approach if it brings you joy, but if you're looking to grow this is the lecture for you. I break down the four



different stages of a quilter. I then share my process for finding the color palette that represents you.



Erin Grogan, the pattern designer and founder of Love Sew Modern, was introduced to sewing by her grandmother, a professional seamstress. When Erin was a child she would fill a notebook with fashion designs with the dream of one day becoming a clothing designer. Her grandmother would come to visit for many weeks in the summer. Erin and her grandmother would go to Hancock Fabrics to get material and together they would sew her school wardrobe for the next year. These precious moments sparked her love for design.

In 2017 Erin took her first trip to a modern quilt shop. Surrounded by all the bright and bold fabrics and

modern quilts she knew in that moment she wanted to become a quilter. In January of 2020 Erin left her corporate job to focus on growing her dream, Love Sew Modern.

# COMMUNITY SERVICE REPORT

I delivered 10 quilts to Hopes and dreams in June. Over 20 kits were passed out at Celebration 2022. More were passed out at the June and October Meetings. I hope to receive more at our next in person meeting

The Hopes and Dreams contest runs from August 1 to July 31<sup>st</sup>.

We won  $3^{rd}$  place this year and received some prizes which were shared at the October meeting. Quilter's dream batting also gave me a roll of 60 in wide select and four rolls of 10 inch wide fusible select batting. I passed out 10 60" x 60" pieces and 5 10" x 120" pieces of batting in October. I thought the fusible would be great for making stripped pieced quilt as you go blocks

In October I received 16 finished quilts and one top that needed quilting. I delivered the 16 finished quilts to Hopes and Dreams. They will be part of this coming years count. Hopefully I will receive more quilts at the March and June meeting so that we will win First place again. I will not be at the March meeting, but someone from Tidewater will collect them and deliver them to me.

I want to remind our members that if they just like to piece tops and don't really know how to quilt them that we have members who are willing to quilt the tops for them. They can bring them to any meeting or mail them to me.

I do have about 20 bassinet covers to deliver. Perhaps we could have a charity class in June to concentrate on making them again.

Here are a few suggestions for the Silent Auction to help you get started with your planning:

- Notions, Scissors, Rulers, embellishments and Threads.
- Quilt patterns or books.
- Organizational tools and/or containers.

For Celebration! 2024 we look forward to commemorating 40 years of VCQ Quilting Friendships! This colorful "Friendship Scrap Block" is a perfect choice for the Block Lotto Patch. The block is 12 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" unfinished and is constructed as a four patch. Each kit will include clear sewing instructions and 24 off-white triangles, enough to make two blocks. These triangles create a border between the corners and the center of the block (see photo). Each of the four corner triangles should utilize a different bright colorful fabric, prints or tone-on-tone. Trading fabrics with VCQ friends is encouraged and adds to the scrappiness. Just remember that the block must be sewn with a scant <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" seam allowance so all the parts fit together properly. The blocks will be raffled off at Celebration! 2024. 
