Area 4-Charlottesville, Lynchburg, Madison, Culpeper

Area 5-Richmond

Area 6-Fredericksburg & east to Chesapeake Bay

Area 7-Southwest VA (Wytheville, Martinsville, Danville, Marion, Galax, NC)

Area 8-Peninsula (Northern Neck, Eastern Shore, Williamsburg)

Area 9-Tidewater/Southside (Norfolk, VA Beach, Chesapeake, Suffolk, Franklin). These are subject to changes as volunteers change.

Duties:

- 1.Attend VCQ Board meetings via Zoom
- 2.Bring to the VCQ Board any membership concerns from the area represented.
- 3.Keep a supply of VCQ membership forms and VCQ brochures on hand to distribute to guilds and shops in your area. Business cards are also available.
- 4. When the VCQ roster is passed out, make sure as many as possible are picked up to save the mailing expense and be responsible for distributing to members that you will see. (Since we switched to an online directory, it is only mailed to those who don't have online access.)
- 5. Promote VCQ each and every opportunity that presents itself-be the Ambassador.

- 7. Visit guilds in your area to talk about VCQ, answer questions, and encourage membership (you may have to invite yourself!). Share meeting info on any distribution lists you have access to.
- 8. Area Representatives are asked to serve as the Nominating Committee for Board of Directors.

Notice of Membership Fee Change

At the March 11, 2023 business meeting, the board presented a motion to increase the membership fees from \$25 to \$30 starting with the 2024 year. After discussion and clarification of the start of the fee change, the membership voted to increase the annual membership fee to \$30 beginning with the payment for the year 2024.

Anyone who has already paid for multiple years does not owe any additional membership fee. The change does not go into effect until the publication in the newsletter. After publication of the change in fees the amount due for 2024 and subsequent years is \$30 per year. Example, I am paying my membership dues for 2023, 2024 and 2025 on May 15, 2023. MINUTES OF THE LAST GENERAL MEETING:

VCQ General Membership Meeting Saturday March 11, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 12:45 by President Karen Brewster. Karen welcomed members and introduced Debby Kratovil of Herndon, VA. Debby spoke on "Modern My Way" along with a trunk show of her quilts. Debby also gave out 8 different door prizes ranging from fabric to patterns to kits.

The business portion of the meeting began at 1:48. Announcements: President Brewster asked for corrections to the October minutes. None were noted. Karin Fisher made a motion to accept them as posted. Faye Hannah seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Information was given that the new Charity block pattern is in the newsletter. Virginia Quilt Museum has Vintage Quilt Pattern for sale named Harrisonburg. All proceeds go to the Museum.

Members were reminded that we offer Come Quilt With Me (CQWM) every month on the 1st Tuesday from 1-4 and the 3rd Saturday from 9-12. The link is available in Members Only Section.

Newsletter deadline is April 15th.

Members presented a quilt that was made from block members sent in to Deb Schupp as outgoing President. Many thanks to her leadership in keeping VCQ going during the pandemic.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Treasurer: Wendy Collyer announced our Balance Sheet is currently \$35,383.25 and our annual budget is at (-2,919.00). Marty Moon (?) moved to accept the report and Karan Fisher seconded. The motion carried.

Membership: Faye Hannah announced we had 3 new members and 1 guest attending.

Programs: Elizabeth Gibson announced she is working on a program for July 8th Zoom. She did not want to give a name since it was not finalized yet. She will send out the information once it is finalized and you can register on the website.

In-Person Programs: Debi Harding was not present, but President Karen Brewster announced that we are working on getting a location for June in Gloucester.

Community Service: Karin McElvein was not present. Faye Hannah collected the ALS quilts to deliver to Karin.

Publicity: Kelly Zuber is working on more ideas to get us recognized. The idea was put out to make business cards with QR code on them. She will look into doing that.

Celebration: Deb Schupp announced that she has the teachers all set. She is almost finished setting up the Committee. The dates are April 18-21, 2024. She is waiting on the costs for the Facility to be sent. Celebration will be competing with Mid-Atlantic Quilt Show and Quilt Con as many people travel to those as well. Anyone wanting to volunteer to help can contact Deb.

NEW BUSINESS: President Karen Brewster announced that at the Board Retreat it was decided that VCQ needs to increase the cost of membership from \$25/yr to \$30/yr. It would start in 2024. It was asked how it would work for those who pay ahead. Example was given that if someone sends in membership application in July 2023 (so they can attend Celebration) and adds on 2024 and 2025, they would pay \$25 for 2023, \$30 for 2024 and 2025. So they would send in \$85. The increase would not begin until it has been announced in Newsletter and put out on website. It was explained that the cost of teachers has increased to the range of \$600-\$700, facility costs are more... costs are increasing across the board. Ann Tinsman made a motion to accept the increase. Susan Beard seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Karen Brewster announced a President's Challenge. She is asking for members to create Red & White quilts in honor of our 40th Anniversary in 2024. The quilts will be due at Celebration. The meeting was adjourned at 2:32 for members to go back to their classes. Respectfully submitted, Lisa Frieman

Lost Stories by Kitty Bull

Recently, I listened to a panel discussion on "Textile Talks" about how to document and label quilts that have no known provenance attached. This panel of four quilt historians spoke about the "old" textiles that they had acquired or been involved in documenting for museums or private citizens during appraisals that they knew nothing about. They also discussed how these lost treasures could be documented starting with "How much do we actually know about this textile?"

The panel participants agreed that putting a name on the quilt should be done but there was a bit of discussion about "naming" the patterns as many quilt patterns have multiple names and are different depending on where the quilt was made. For most of the panel, what they really wanted to know was what the quilt maker or the family who owned it had "named" the quilt. One thing that they all agreed on was that the quilt being documented or appraised needed at least to have a label added to it even if it was only to say who the current owner is and when and where it was acquired. A **prewashed muslin label** can be embroidered, (machine or by hand), written on with Pigma pens, or a printer generated label that the ink can be heat set and washed before being sewn onto the quilt can be used to identify what information is currently known.

One good point of the discussion was to pay closer attention to each part of an old textile as the maker may have added a date or name within the actual quilting that may not be noticed unless a close examination is made. It is especially important to look for this on those quilts with unknown history. One theme apparent throughout the talk is that documenting a textile, whether it is Aunt Gracie's crocheted tablecloth, or something picked up at auction or a baby's "Welcome to the World" quilt, was the writing down of any information about the piece **should be done and should be done before we forget**.

So, have you begun the stories of those quilt projects, finished or unfinished, in your possession? What about those treasures you have been given? Do they have the actual maker's name or a date completed or why they were made, or even the name of the quilt somewhere on it. Will the quilts that you have worked so hard to complete be able to share their stories or will someone, somewhere in 50 years or so be asking, "I wonder what the quilt maker named this?"

Support of the Virginia Quilt Museum Virginia Quilt Museum Donor Reception

I recently had the pleasure to attend a donor reception at the Virginia Quilt Museum honoring world renowned quilter, designer and author Jinny Beyer. Some of her best-known quilts have been on display at VQM and I hope many of you had a chance to go see them. I represented VCQ, as well as my husband and myself, as long-time donors to the museum, but most recently for the past year while I was president of VCQ. The main room of the museum was filled with quilters, eager to hear Jinny's quilting story.

Jinny told of her interest early in her career in the richly colored, strongly patterned fabrics of Nepal and India at a time when fabric in this country was pale and less complex. Many of her designs are complicated tessellations which flow smoothly from one shape to another, utilizing a wide range of colors, shapes and values. She also explained that her search for dark fabrics for her quilts led to her decision to design her own fabric lines to sell only to Quilt Shops and eventually opening her own quilt shop to sell only her fabrics. All along, she has been several steps ahead of industry trends and has been proven to understand her fellow quilters and what they want.

Jinny retired in 2022, after 50 years working in the quilting industry, and is now spending lots of time researching and documenting her 1760s home in Virginia. She no longer has a retail shop or sells fabric on her website, though the last five collections have been printed and are being sold in quilt shops. Jinny added that in the contest of "She Who Dies With the Most Fabric Wins", she will win, without a doubt! We have nothing on her.

After her remarks, the audience wandered the museum to enjoy all the beautiful quilts on display by other artists, both upstairs and down. Please join the museum as a member and support VQM's efforts to "cultivate and preserve the quilting arts in Virginia". Our personal support is vital to their long-term success in preserving our heritage and growing the art of quilting into the future.

Let's Have a Scrappy Fun Day with these two great classes! Workshop A: She Shed Quilt (Half Log Cabin) Controlled or Improvised with Amanda Lightfoot



This is a fun and modern take on a traditional log cabin block. Quick to finish and with very few points to match, this makes for low stress and fun colorful outcomes. It's perfect for using up left over 5" squares and $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips from previous projects, or for cutting down your scrap pile. The 20 blocks make a generous lap quilt of $50\frac{1}{2}$ x

 $62 \frac{1}{2}$ but it is easy to size. Add borders to change the look or use improvisational piecing to make it as freeform as you'd like.

Free pattern will be provided on the day of class.

Sewing Machine Project Class Skill Level: Basic Sewing Skills

Supply List: - Fabric and Notions Required:

- 20 5 x 5" square. Mine are a solid grey which provides a bit of calm to the riot of color. You could also use a variety of neutrals, bright solids or go color crazy for a total scrappy look.
- 2 ½" strips of varying lengths. If working in a more controlled way you use two of each color, the lengths required for this are provided below:

20 - 2 ½ x 12" strips minimum

 $20 - 2 \frac{1}{2} \times 16$ strips minimum

 $20 - 2 \frac{1}{2} \times 20$ strips minimum

20 – 2 ½ x 24" strips minimum

If you want a more random, less planned look then bring a variety of 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ strips of any length. These can be added together to get the required lengths. Just be sure to bring a minimum of 80 x 24" long strips.

- Rotary Cutter, mat and quilt ruler a minimum of 6 x 24", also square quilt ruler to square 13" block (although if your piecing is pretty good, and given the nature of the block, squaring up is minimal and not essential).
- Thread in a medium neutral color
- A sewing machine that will stitch a straight ¼"
- Your preferred ¼" foot
- Some straight pins.

About your teacher:

Amanda was born and raised just outside Belfast, Northern Ireland, she is married to Michael and has only children with fur and four feet.

She started sewing at the age of five on an old Singer treadle machine and has sewn ever since. In the early years she sewed doll clothes and customized her own clothes with ribbons, lace and sequins. Eventually this progressed to taking a sewing qualification that included fine tailoring, craft sewing and home décor. Her journey with quilting started in the 1970's when her Mum taught her how to do English Paper Piecing using cardboard, newspaper and fabrics reclaimed at Jumble Sales or whatever fabrics could be recycled.

Whilst Amanda's professional life led her into a long career in Human Resources and Management Development, Training and Coaching, she continued to sew and work in creative fields, including training professional painters in using decorate paint effects and glazing, paper crafting and scrapbooking. At various times she has done silk painting, silver clay jewelry, mosaics, stained and foiled glass, hand embroidery, cross stitch and knitting. Her sewing journey has led her to make her own formal ballgowns, jackets, drapes, decorative cushions, pillows and of course quilts. stores. Sewing Machine Project Class

Skill Level: Beginner+ Basic Sewing Skills

Supply List:

- * 48- 5 inch Scrappy Squares (needed for 16 Patches)
- * 48- 5 inch Squares of Medium to Dark also Scrappy (needed for Pinwheel Blocks)
 - 2 yards of Background Fabric (I use white on white) * Cut 13 strips 5 inches wide,

then sub-cut the strips into around 96 (more or less) 5 inch squares.

- 1 yard for Inner Border & Binding (will not need for class)
- 1- 1/2 Yards for Outer Border (will not need for class)
- Basic sewing supplies with rotary cutter, mat & ruler, thread, scissors & bobbins full.
- Bring your machine power cord & petal and be ready for lots of laugher and fun!

Kit Fee: \$3.00 for your color pattern, to be purchased from the instructor.
